Staffing Needs

This past week included a lot of conversation about our staffing needs at the Shrine. At the top of this list is a new Director of Sacred Music as well as security guards to patrol throughout the day. Various options and possibilities have been suggested, but we are still discerning the best way to proceed. There is no question that we need both roles filled, but we have to balance these needs with our current financial realities. My hope is to make some significant moves over the next couple of weeks to get us closer to where we want to be. In the meantime, if you know of anyone who would be interested in working as a part-time security guard or as a full-time Director of Sacred Music, please invite them to reach out to me or one of the Friars.

Where is the image of Divine Mercy?

In the bulletin last weekend, I shared about the incident involving the Divine Mercy image in the Saints' Grotto. Since then, we went to Michael's (where we originally got the image framed) to have them fix the glass. When we arrived and finally took the image out, we noticed that there was damage to the actual print, and that the glass that remained in the frame fused to the print, making it unusable. Luckily, there is a stamp on the back of the image that indicates where it came from: the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Krakow, Poland! I immediately reached out to them to ask for their help, and after a bit of back and forth, we determined that I should connect with their community in Stockbridge, MA. As a result of that interaction, we ordered a new Divine Mercy image and as soon as it arrives, we will have it framed and rehung in the Saints' Grotto. Please continue to pray for the gentleman who did this and for all those who need God's divine mercy in their lives.

Update on Monthly Second Collections

Starting this month, we have decided to reimagine our monthly second collections so that we are more intentional in supporting a wider range of ministries throughout the region, country, and world.
